The old registers have been replaced. Councillor Toms is looking into how we can get work done on the driveway in later spring to once again fix the holes.

We would also like to thank Brad, Bryan and Steve for assisting with snow removal and keeping it in great condition for all the skaters. The replies and also the personal messages to some of us show that having a new surface for the basketball court is high on the list and after getting some quotes and ideas, this is what we will be pursuing. We also heard that the grips on the swings need to be replaced and that project will be done for sure in the spring. The zipline was another item highlighted. Of note is that it was tightened 18" in late fall and we will look at what it may need again in the spring. We opted out of putting a seat on the zipline at this time. We should know the results of our grant application by early April and will get to work on the basketball/multisport court as soon as we can if it is approved!
